Councilmember Wayne Potts led the council in prayer.

Ryan Drane, with Graves County Economic Development, addressed the council and gave projections for 2018 and updates from 2017.

On a motion by Cox, and seconded by Potts, and with Cox, Summers, Potts, O'Nan, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, and Elder voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved the minutes, from both the December 11 & 27, 2017 meetings. Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

On a motion made by Summers, seconded by Cox, with Cox, Summers, Potts, O'Nan, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, and Elder voting yea and none voting nay, Council approved on second reading Ordinance 36-17 "an ordinance, amending the code of ordinances, City of Mayfield Kentucky, chapter 16, "traffic and motor vehicles", to add section 16-20 (71) creating a four way stop at the intersection of south 7th and Cleveland Streets." Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion made by Jackson, and seconded by O'Nan, with Jackson, Whitnell, Potts and Summers, voting yea and with Elder, McDonald, O'Nan and Cox voting nay, and with the mayor breaking the tie by voting yea, Council approved on second reading Ordinance 37-17 "an ordinance of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, enacting new 2017 legislation in accordance with KRS 243.230(2), pertaining to the regulations and requirements for alcohol beverage control as recently updated by the general assembly and administrative agencies;" Motion passed 5-4.

On a motion made by Whitnell, seconded by Potts, with Cox, Summers, Potts, O'Nan, Whitnell, Jackson and Elder voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved **Resolution 1-1-18** amending the 2017-2018 budget to include Fuller Community Facilities Corporation in the annual allotments, in the amount \$1,000.00. Motion passed seven with one abstaining, due to being a current board member.

On a motion made by McDonald, seconded by Cox with Elder, McDonald, Jackson, Whitnell, O'Nan, Potts, Summers and Cox voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved **Resolution 1-2-18** allowing the Mayor to sign documents to purchase property located at N 17th St. Motion passed unanimously.

Reports from Department Heads and Committees were given.
