


How Mayfield Got Its Name



Neat Old Houses


The **Anderson house** is known as the first house in Mayfied, lived in by John Anderson, the first known settler of Mayfield in 1819.

The **'Edana Locus' mansion** was named after its owners, Ed Gardner and his wife, Ana. The 14-room home was built in 1926 and originally cost \$75,000 to build. The mansion is now used by the Chamber of Commerce.




Making Pants and Suits

Did you know that the first female sheriff in the United States was in Mayfield? In 1922, Lois Roach stepped up to protect the community that she was from.




Movies, Books and Television


Mayfield has had its share of fame over the years. Here are just a few fun facts:
