

# CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

March 13, 2023

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a regular meeting on March 13, 2023, at 5:00 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. There were present Mayor Kathy O’Nan, City Attorney Jay Matheny, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator Jeremy Creason, Public Works Director Russ Brower and City Clerk Karen Wilson.

Police Chief Nathan Kent opened the city council meeting.

Councilmember Johnny Jackson led the council in prayer.

Councilmember Barry McDonald led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan presented the members of the Graves County High School Girls Bowling Team certificates and keys to the city in recognition of their back-to-back KHSAA State Bowling Championships. Coach Gary Latta was also recognized as the State Women’s bowling Coach of the Year.

Johnnie Calloway of 316 S 16<sup>th</sup> Street, Mayfield addressed the council and explained the purpose of Trixie’s Sober Living House. It is a home for men who have gone through drug rehabilitation and helps them to continue to stay drug free.

On a motion by Adams, and seconded by Rodgers, with Poole, Adams, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Cox, Parrott and Carr voting yea, and none voting nay, council approved the minutes from the February 13<sup>th</sup> and February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023, council meetings. Motion passed unanimously.

## OLD BUSINESS

On a motion by McDonald, seconded by Poole, with Poole, Adams, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Cox, Parrott and Carr voting yea, and Jackson voting nay, council approved on second reading **Ordinance 2-23** “an ordinance adopting Design Guidelines and Standards for Damage Recovery Overlay Precinct (Drop) B-3 Mixed Use Zone.” Motion passed 8-1.

## NEW BUSINESS

On a motion by Jackson, seconded by Parrott, with Carr, Parrott, Cox, Jackson, McDonald, Whitnell, Rodgers, Adams and Poole voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved on first reading **Ordinance 3-23** “an ordinance re-zoning certain real property within the City of Mayfield from “I-1 Light Industrial” to “R-2 Multi-Family Residential.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Whitnell, seconded by Cox, with Poole, Adams, Rodgers, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Cox, Parrott and Carr voting yea, and with none voting nay, council approved **Municipal Order 3-23** “a municipal order approving and authorizing the use of insurance proceeds for the construction, repair, and restoration of Public Works Facilities for the City of Mayfield.” Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Jackson, seconded by Carr, with Carr, Parrott, Cox, Jackson, McDonald, Whitnell, Rodgers, Adams, and Poole voting yea and with none voting nay, council approved **Municipal Order 4-23** “a municipal order authorizing and directing Kathy S. O’Nan, mayor, to executed any and all documents necessary to effectuate the participation of the City

of Mayfield in the settlement of pending litigation with Allergan, CVS, Teva, Walgreens and Wal-Mart relating to opioid medications in the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the Opioid Litigation)." Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by McDonald, and with all present voting yea, council agreed to accept the recommendation of the Planning Commission to close an alley between Dowdy and Clark Streets. An ordinance for this closure will be presented at the next council meeting.

Councilmember Johnny Jackson read a letter from a citizen expressing concerns about the size of dog pens.

Department heads gave their reports.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 5:55 p.m.
