

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

September 27, 2022

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a special called meeting on September 27, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. There were present Mayor Kathy O'Nan, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator, Jeremy Creason, Police Lt. Derek Vaughan, Public Works Director Russ Brower, Attorney Bo Neely, and City Clerk Karen Wilson.

Police Lt. Derek Vaughan opened the city council meeting.

Councilmember Chuck Whitnell led the council in prayer.

Councilmember Carol Todd led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

OLD BUSINESS

On a motion by McDonald and seconded by Parrott, with Carr, Adams, Whitnell, McDonald, Jackson, Rodgers, Parrott and Todd voting yea, and with none voting nay, Council approved on second reading **Fiscal Ordinance 4-22**, "an ordinance levying an Ad Valorem tax upon all property in the City of Mayfield, Kentucky as applied to the 2022 assessment of taxable property as provided by the Property Valuation Administrator of Graves County." Motion passed unanimously.

On a motion by Adams, seconded by Rodgers, with Todd, Parrott, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, McDonald, and Adams voting yea, and with Carr abstaining, Council approved on second reading **Ordinance 8-22** "an ordinance establishing a payroll tax rebate program for qualified commercial facility developers, property owners and tenants." Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Kathy O'Nan gave an update on the planning of a memorial program for December 10th. She also recognized those attending the recent KLC Conference in Owensboro.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Don Costello presented a request from the Planning Commission to allow a temporary structure for an operations center for FNB Bank.

The Council unanimously voted to accept the Planning Commission's request to approve a temporary structure at 203 North 8th Street Mayfield, KY, to serve as the FNB operations center.

On a motion by Rodgers, seconded by Whitnell, with Carr, Adams, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, McDonald, Parrott and Todd voting yea, and none voting nay, Council approved on first reading **Ordinance 9-22** "an ordinance amending the code of ordinances of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky Chapter 13 "Planning and Development Section 13-11(b) Mayfield Recreational, Tourist and Convention Commission." Motion passed unanimously.

Reverend Al Chandler of the Long Term Recovery Group addressed the Council requesting that the City allow a temporary RV to be placed at 1003 Pine Lane while repairs are being made to the residence.

On a motion by Jackson, seconded by Rodgers, with Todd, Parrott, McDonald, Whitnell, Jackson, Rodgers, Adams and Carr voting yea, and none voting nay, Council requested Attorney Bo Neely draft an ordinance to accommodate the placement of temporary recreational vehicles to be used for housing by the Long Term Recovery Group. Motion passed Unanimously.

With no further business to come before the Council, the meeting was adjourned at 5:40 p.m.
