

CITY COUNCIL MINUTES CITY OF MAYFIELD, KENTUCKY

October 10, 2022

The City Council of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky, met in a regular meeting on October 10, 2022, at 5:02 p.m. at the Purchase Area Development District. There were present Mayor Kathy O’Nan, Fire Chief, Ambulance Director & Community Development Coordinator, Jeremy Creason, Police Chief Nathan Kent, Assistant Public Works Director Aaron Blount, Attorney Bo Neely, and City Clerk Karen Wilson.

Police Chief Nathan Kent opened the city council meeting.

Fire Chief Jeremy Creason led the council in prayer.

Council member Carol Todd led the council in the pledge to the American flag.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan read a proclamation declaring October to be National Long-Term Residents Rights Month. Stephanie Nimmo an advocate for residents of long-term facilities was present to accept the proclamation.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan also read a proclamation declaring the week of October 9-15, 2022 to be Kentucky Extension Homemakers Week.

On a motion by Adams and seconded by Rodgers, with Carr, Adams, Todd, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, Parrott and Johnny Lee Jackson voting yea and with none voting nay, Council approved minutes from the September 12, September 19, and September 27, 2022, meetings. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan updated the community on Halloween Parade for Saturday, October 15, 2022, and the City Scavenger Hunt. She announced that there would be no special called meetings on the fourth Tuesday in the months of November and December.

OLD BUSINESS

On a motion by Carr, seconded by Adams, with Carr, Adams, Rodgers, Jackson, Whitnell, Parrott, Todd, Johnny Lee Jackson voting yea, and none voting nay, Council approved on second reading **Ordinance 9-22** an ordinance amending the code of ordinances of the City of Mayfield, Kentucky Chapter 13 “Planning and Development Section 13-11(b) Mayfield Recreational, Tourist and Convention Commission.” Motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

The Council was presented with an **Executive Order 9-22** regarding Long Term Recovery Group temporary housing within the city limits.

Department Heads gave their monthly reports.

Mayor Kathy O’Nan stated that there would be a Service of Remembrance on December 10, 2022. Plans include honoring those who were lost during the tornado, recognizing first responders and focusing on hope for the future.
